

Important Notice for Corporate Registry Clients

Self-Serve Application for (Voluntary) Dissolution Available December 4, 2006

Starting on December 4, 2006, the Application for (Voluntary) Dissolution for B.C. companies will become a self-serve filing in Corporate Online. Instead of filling in Form 17 and mailing it to the Corporate Registry, you will be able to file the dissolution electronically using Corporate Online.

Before dissolving a company, the company must first comply with section 316 of the [Business Corporations Act](#).

The company must be in good standing as of the date the Application for Dissolution (Voluntary Dissolution) is filed. Good standing means that the company is up-to-date with its annual report filings.

This new electronic dissolution transaction will also include a video demonstration and online help to assist you with filing online. You will be able to complete your filing using a valid credit card or, for BC OnLine customers, using your BC OnLine account.

The fee to file an Application for Dissolution (Voluntary Dissolution) using Corporate Online will be \$21.59.

Once the Application for Dissolution (Voluntary Dissolution) has been filed using Corporate Online, the registrar will provide confirmation of the dissolution of the company by issuing and providing a copy of the certificate of dissolution to the person shown in the application as having custody of the "dissolved company records", as well as to the "person submitting the application" on behalf of the company. The registrar will also publish notice of the dissolution on the [Queen's Printer](#) Web site.
